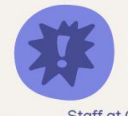
## Empowering

We strive to ensure Catholic education is committed to excellence, continual transformation and meeting all Church and Government requirements.



**Focus on Five Teacher Practices**

- \* Teachers from Year 2 and Year 3 have been a part of a Scitech Mathematics Problem Solving Professional Learning Opportunity this year and hosted the project lead from Scitech, at school.
- \* Staff participation in SCSA review of the Australian Curriculum. OLG, representing primary teachers in the Catholic System, were thanked for contributing by the Director of Teaching and Learning.
- \* Instructional Range was the focus of Professional Learning for all staff in 2021.
- \* The Growth Action Plan (GAP) developed by a team of teachers over the past 14 months will be presented to staff next term. The plan is linked to the Five Teacher Practices and the Staff Wellbeing Strategy.
- \* Staff representation on Boards at CEWA include: 2 x Lighthouse Math, 3 x Digital Leadership, 1 x Wellbeing Leader, 1 x Early Years Leader, 1 x Middle Year Leader, 1 x Data Communication and 1 x CEWA Mathematic Framework Communication.



**Expand opportunities for all students to develop critical, creative and higher order thinking skills.**

- \* Staff at OLG give a considerable amount of their time above and beyond their classroom and school wide work. Some examples of extra opportunities provided for our children include:
  - Lego club with Mrs Lloyd
  - Gardening club
  - Craft club – selection of House Day events
  - Chess club @ lunchtime
  - TOM – 5 teams in regional events, 1 in state final
  - Robocup – 13 participants, classes held after school over a period of 6 weeks
  - Library Monitors & Book Club
  - STEM Club with 40 students over 2 hours per week
  - One Big Voice
  - Cluedunnit competition, 'The Inspectigators' were the 2021 Winners – 4 students completed 10+ hours with Mrs Fenlon over the course of a term.
  - Orchestra/guitar ensemble
  - Junior and Senior Choir
  - Math extension
  - Creative writing extension
  - Boulderling
  - Run Club – average of 50 students per week
  - Surf Club
  - Circus Club – 40 students per week

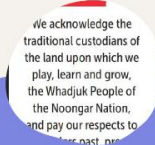
**Provide visual recognition of Aboriginal Culture and land in the school environment.**

- \* NAIDOC Week celebrations were held and were very successful. The week began with a prayer service and smoking ceremony. Lunchtime games, online story telling opportunities & classroom resources. Information was provided to parents and an educational video link provided to assist in their cultural competency.
- \* New Acknowledgement of Country signage near reception
- \* We include Acknowledgement of Country before prayer at all significant gatherings.



**Develop a leadership and governance structure appropriate for a triple stream school.**

- \* High level working Groundsman employed to complete maintenance work
- \* 5 year maintenance plan document completed and approved
- \* Project for a new toilet block in the Early Years has been approved and works to commence shortly
- \* On site school canteen now operates daily
- \* Physical Movement Specialist employed to run before and after school activities. To date we have commenced a running club (over 100 in first week attended), boulderling with our year 5 group, surf club for our year 6's and most recently a Circus Club.



## Compassion

Central to our identity as a Christ-centred community are our partnerships with families, Parish and the wider community. We are a Catholic pastoral community that enhances parent and student engagement.



**Communicate to the Parish and wider community the unique qualities of Our Lady of Grace School.**

- \* Survey's sent to OLG Community as new projects evolve such as Uniform, Highway Heroes, Bullying Policy, Learning Environment Committee. In total over 650 parents were sent the surveys.
- \* Review of how we communicate to our school community undertaken in November 2021 – sent to over 650 parents and caregivers
- \* Invitation to school events extended to Parishoners, such as Christmas Carols and Nativity Play's
- \* Fundraising event for St Vincent De Paul and the Lord Mayor's Fire Appeal (25/2) raised \$878 and over 400 non-perishable food items for St Vincent De Paul. Data regarding our contribution to the Parish St Vincent De Paul chapter in 2021 include;
  - Over 400+ Easter Eggs with 51 family baskets and over 20 individual large egg gifts for families donated
  - A weekly basket of food from Year levels attending Mass on Wednesday's
  - 780 individual items of food collected during House Days
  - 700 toiletry items collected during Wellbeing Day
  - Staff Christian Service opportunity provided a dozen homecooked and frozen meals for St Vincent De Paul.

- \* Employment of Physical Movement Specialist who has since introduced various initiatives such as run club, surfing, brain breaks, boulderling and circus club
- \* Celebrating Mother's Day and Father's Day with different heartfelt experiences. Over 300 dads attended Father's Day and 400 mugs supplied to Mum's
- \* Learning enrichment activities such as RoboCup and TOM (Tournaments of the Mind)
- \* Introduction of Highway Heroes and Bullying Policy and the resources purchased for parents to read at their leisure available in reception

- Reconciliation Week activities were completed throughout the week across all year levels. These included artwork, kangaroo sausage tasting for all children and educational lessons on the history and its significance today.
- Acknowledgement of Country signage around the school
- We include Acknowledgement of Country before prayer at all significant gatherings and in all presentations.



Develop a leadership and governance structure appropriate for a triple stream school.

- 5 year maintenance plan document completed and approved
- Project for a new toilet block in the Early Years has been completed
- High level working Groundsman employed to complete maintenance work
- The Environment Committee and P&F have approved a project to redevelop our spaces outside Year 1, 2, 3 and MPA/Canteen to enable room for children to play and learn outside
- On site school canteen operates daily
- Physical Movement Specialist employed to run before and after school activities. This year we have completed run club, bouldering, surfing lessons, Circus Club and gymnastics. The role also undertakes an assessment in Kindy for fundamental movement skills. An intervention program, where required is offered to identified students.
- Little Graces Out of School Hours Care up and running, including Vacation Care provided across all school holidays.
- New MPA sound system installed

- The 4 virtues evident within our learning environment

- Parishioners were invited to attend various events this year such as Grandparent's Day, Mother's Day, Nativity etc

- The Religious Education Program at OLG is reviewed consistently and a pedagogical approach taken.

- Year 6 Ministry and Leadership was redeveloped to include Christian Service.

- 3 outdoor learning spaces developed in courtyards in Year 3, Year 1/2 and near the MPA
- The Hive has been redesigned to be a contemporary learning space with the focus on books, information access and the love of reading with various seating options, an outdoor garden and reading nooks.

#### Early Years Learning Framework Principles and Play Based Intentional Teaching is embedded in the Early Years Pre Kindy to Year 2. Embed and extend Early Years service to the school and community.

- The Early Years Charter has been used as a working document over the last 4 years.

#### Focus on Five Teacher Practices: Quality Relationships ~ Instructional range ~ Learning design ~ Place, space and technology ~ Engagement

- We have completed 2 Climate Survey's for parents to provide feedback
- PL Days completed to develop best practice in Literacy and Numeracy for all teaching staff
- Staff professional development ongoing & regularly undertaken

#### Seamless integration of ICT from Pre-Primary to Year 6. Expand opportunities for all students to develop critical, creative and higher order thinking skills. Extension of iPad program and IT Conference for parents led by the students

- Our dedicated IT team developed an IT strategy and rolled this out to students. This educationally appropriate document is consistently referred to within each year level.
- Teacher and parent education and support for integration of ICT into the curriculum

- 2024 will see the introduction of an OLG Reconciliation Plan

- Each year our budgets are well thought out and prepared, with the aim to prioritise support for families
- As we are nearly a full triple stream school, planning for future resourcing is paramount
- This year saw the development of underutilised areas in our outdoor environment, turning them into usable outdoor learning areas for students
- Our 2 maintenance employees have developed a strong and targeted maintenance and upgrade plan
- A well thought out Risk Management Plan has been developed and it used consistently
- Governance, structures and policies are robust, responsive and accountable
- Staff selection process in place to attract diversity of staff and include various salary levels and leadership positions.

#### Communicate to the Parish and wider community the unique qualities of Our Lady of Grace School

- Weekly inclusion in the Our Lady of Grace Parish CREDO
- After surveying and consulting the parent body, an engagement and communication strategy was developed
- We have increased enrolments at OLG to 90% occupancy

- The CEWA Child Safe Framework is fully implemented
- Child Protective Behaviours is taught as well as Keeping Safe
- A Child Code of Conduct has been developed and implemented
- Diverse opportunities are provided to all students to develop physical capabilities, confidence and collaborative skills through;
  1. Thinking skills/problem solving
  2. Physical activities
  3. The Arts
  4. STEM
  5. Buddy program
  6. Play
- Play is an integral part of each child's day - including before school, during and after school. Examples include regular brain breaks, OLG Sport Clubs such as basketball and netball, summer and winter carnivals as well as our swimming and athletic carnivals.

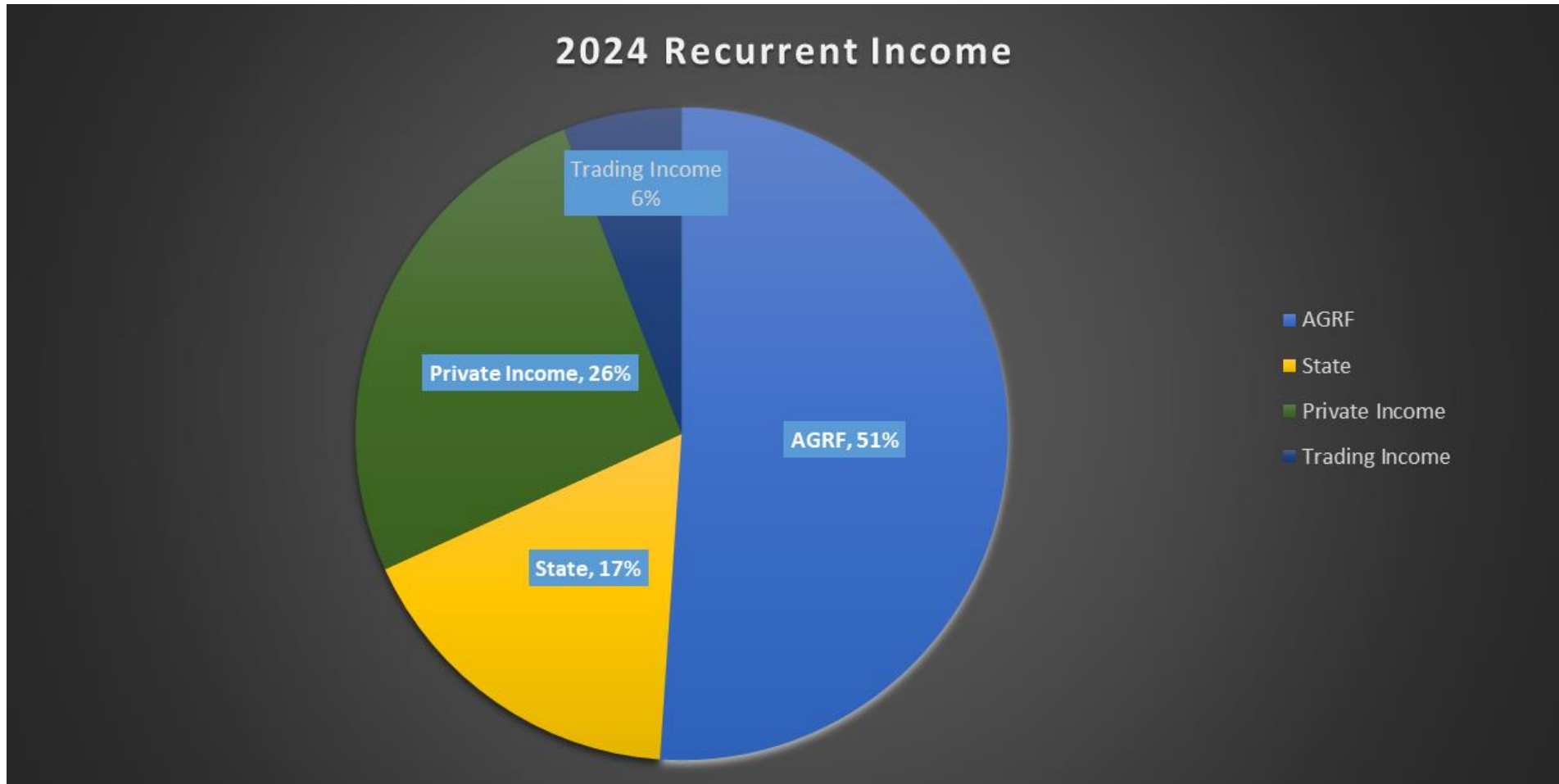

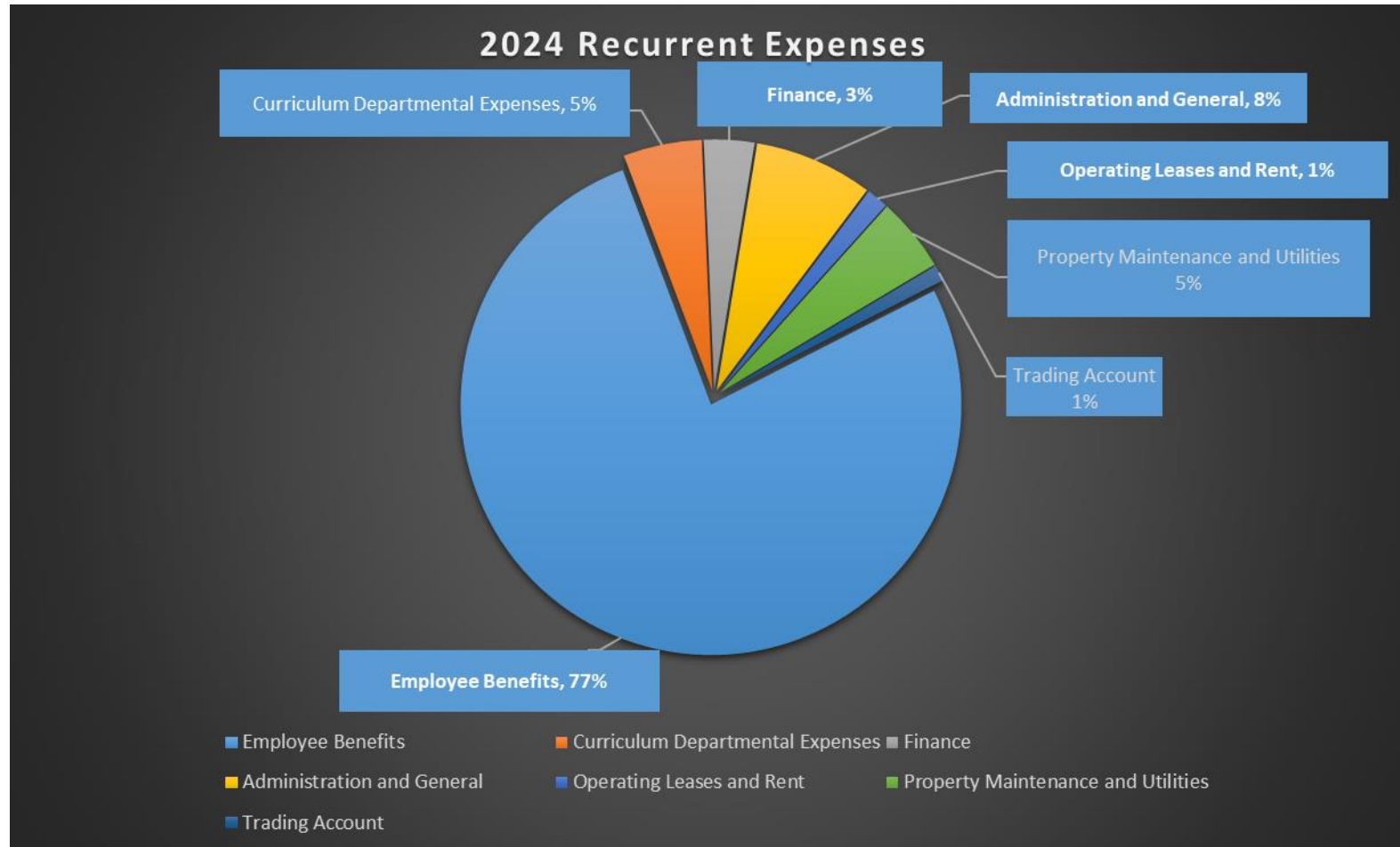

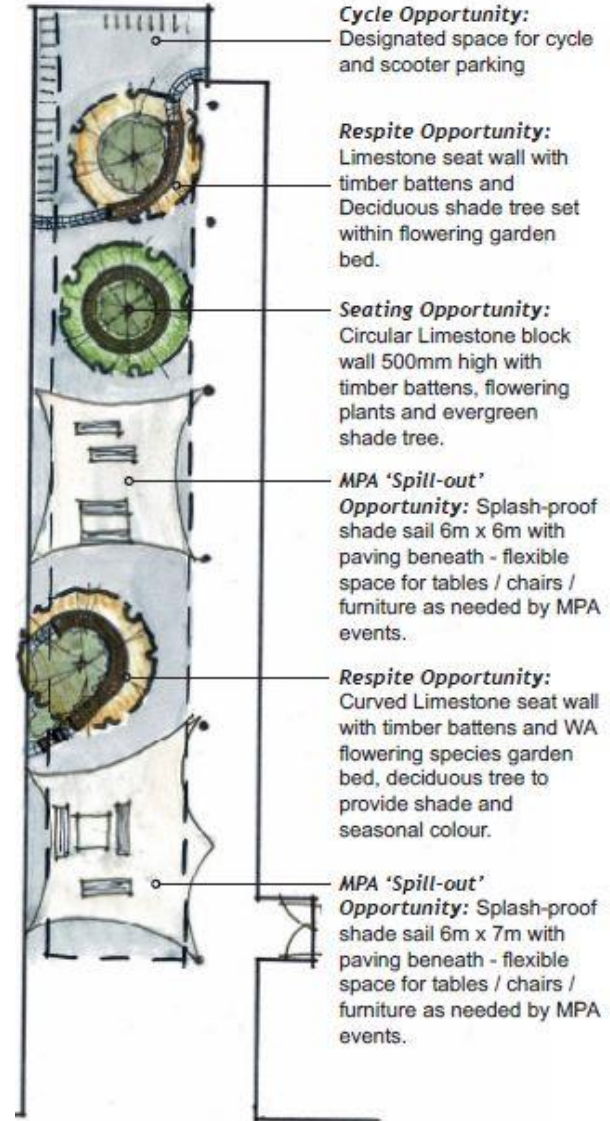
