RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - Penance is the unit of work for Term Three. Please see the parent letters attached to our first School Stream post for the term.

ENGLISH - In Writing, we will be exploring different forms of poetry and learning the structure and features of discussion texts. In Reading, we are focusing on applying comprehension strategies and also reading a range of discussion texts. We will continue with the Sounds Write program in Spelling.

MATHEMATICS - In Mathematics, we are learning about the four operations with decimals, properties of 3D shapes, tessellations and using the inverse operations to solve problems. The students will continue to apply problem solving strategies to attack multi-stepped worded problems. They will be immersed in investigations to develop their knowledge, skills and understandings.

HASS - Students will develop their geographical understanding through studying the different countries of Asia. They will look at the factors that shape the diverse characteristics of the land and how people, places and environments are interconnected, including a study of the Asia's cultural, economic, demographic and social diversity and how it compares to Australia.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGIES - Students will follow a design process to create their own product, or innovate an existing one then pitch their product to class.

Keeping Safe

Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC)

The KS:CPC is a mandated, age appropriate, curriculum that teaches children to recognise abuse, tell a trusted adult, learn strategies for keeping themselves safe and understand what appropriate and inappropriate behaviour is. This term we are learning about safe and unsafe touching and the different types of abuse.

MUSIC - This term in Music, students will explore the 2026 Book Week theme 'A Symphony of Stories' using books as the inspiration for singing, playing instruments, listening, moving, creating and responding to music. During the second half of the term, classes will begin preparing for our Musica Viva incursion 'Music Around the World' which will take place early in Term 4.

PE - This term, in Physical Education, students will further develop their fundamental movement skills through Volleyball by refining techniques, applying tactical strategies and demonstrating effective teamwork. Students will strengthen their leadership, decision-making and sportsmanship while participating in modified games and competitive situations. Later this term, students will prepare for the Athletics Carnival.

VISUAL ART - Students in Year 6 Art this term will be finishing off their Australian Bird pieces of art that we started last term, based on the work of Debbie Dunn. Students will continue refining their drawing, painting and colour mixing skills as they complete these artworks. Students will then design their own dragon's eyes before transforming these designs into clay sculptures. Students will explore a range of sculpting techniques to create texture and detail. To complete their artworks, students will highlight the detail in their sculptures using both matte and metallic paint.

SCIENCE - This term, your child will tackle some of the environmental challenges facing our planet! In our Biological Science unit, we will become environmental scientists as we investigate how changes in the environment and human activities influence the growth and survival of living things. By exploring the impact of natural events and human actions on ecosystems, we will consider how our choices can help create a more sustainable future.
